As you are aware, one of the main priorities of the TTCSI is to assist in the securing of new export opportunities for firms in the services sector. In this regard, we invite you to nominate members of your association to participate in the **First Business Forum of CARICOM - Dominican Republic - Spain** that will take place on the **30th and 31st of May 2011 in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.**

This is part of a project which is being funded under the European project **Pro€Invest** that **amec**, together with the **AIRD** and **CAIC**, are running in the Dominican Republic and the Caribbean. Within the Forum, a **Conference Program** will be held together with a **multi-sectorial Business Meeting Event with the participation of companies and business associations** from the Dominican Republic, CARICOM: Trinidad & Tobago, Antigua & Barbuda, Jamaica and Suriname, and Spain.

TTCSI is a beneficiary of the project through its membership in the CAIC.

Unfortunately, the focus is on goods so the earlier we get confirmation of the service companies on our end, the more effective we can make the matchmaking efforts. The draft agenda and registration form are attached.

The participation of the Caribbean companies is supported by the Pro€Invest program with **financial assistance** consisting of:

- Direct payment of **3 nights** at the Hotel Jaragua Renaissance.
- Reimbursement of **80% of the air ticket** in economy class, up to a maximum of 320 €.

At this point, only two places for TTCSI nominees have been confirmed. However, there is the possibility of further support if there is demand from companies which are export ready.
